

Dr. Timothy Chang received his bachelor's degree from Stanford University and M.D. and Ph.D. from the University of Wisconsin, Madison. He completed a residency in Neurology and fellowship training in Neurobehavior and Movement Disorders at UCLA. During his fellowship training, Dr. Chang completed a postdoctoral research fellowship in genetics before being appointed Assistant Professor of Neurology at UCLA. His clinical expertise focuses on Alzheimer's disease and related dementias, particularly those with associated movement disorders. These include Progressive Supranuclear Palsy, Corticobasal Syndrome, Lewy Body Dementia, Frontotemporal Dementia, and Parkinson's disease. Dr. Chang's research laboratory integrates genomics, electronic health records, and biomedical informatics with the goal of precision medicine equity for neurodegenerative dementias.
