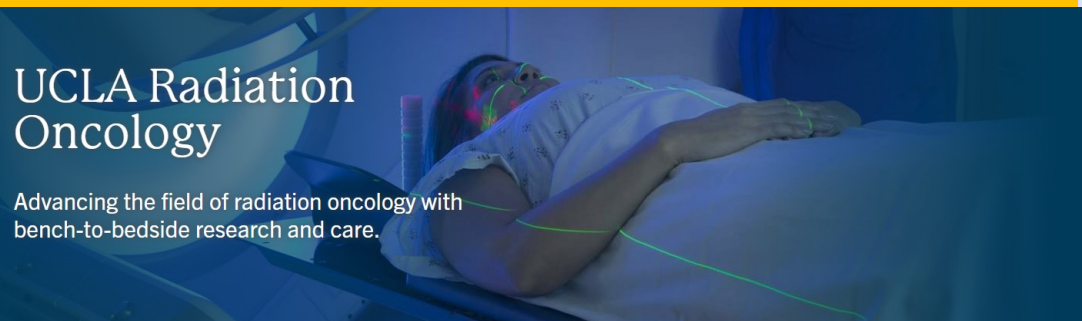


Diversity in Medicine Visiting Student Scholarship

Scholarship Goals:

- Encourage students who hail from underrepresented experiences and backgrounds to consider residency at the University of California Los Angeles, David Geffen School of Medicine
- Promote student awareness of opportunities in academic medicine
- Provide mentoring and networking for students who self-identify as underrepresented in medicine
- Provide a stipend of up to \$2,500 to help offset cost of housing, travel, and any additional expenses related to the rotation.

Who Should Apply:

The Scholarship is open to applicants who have been accepted to participate in a three-week visiting elective at the University California, Los Angeles David Geffen School of Medicine and who hail from underrepresented experiences and backgrounds. All are encouraged to apply .

Applicants must be a 4th year medical student in good standing at an accredited U.S medical school and must have completed all required clerkships through their home institution prior to beginning their visiting student elective.

How To Apply:

The following documents must be submitted to the Department Program Coordinator:

- Application form
- Statement that describes the student's interest in the UCLA Radiation Oncology elective, their path traveled, any work or activities relating to equity, diversity, and inclusion, and any underrepresented lived experiences or backgrounds. (500 word limit)
- One letter of recommendation from a clinical faculty member
- Curriculum vitae

How Scholarship Recipients Will Be Selected: Applications will be reviewed, and recipients selected by members of the Department's EDI Committee and Education Committee.
