Ann M. Hernandez, MD, MS, MPH



Dr. Hernandez is an HS Assistant Professor in the Department of Family Medicine. She completed her clinical training in the UCLA Family Medicine Residency Program and her MD degree at UCLA School of Medicine. While at DGSOM, she completed an MPH in the UCLA Fielding School of Public Health and was part of the UCLA Program in Medical Education in Leadership and Advocacy (PRIME-LA).

Dr. Hernandez was honored as a 2023-2025 Bruin Scholar for her commitment to research that advances the health and health care of diverse patient populations. This prestigious award funds her current research. Dr. Hernandez is also the recipient of a UCLA LIFT-UP pilot research grant to explore doctor-patient decision-making about new pharmacologic treatments (GLP-1 agonists and SGLT-2 inhibitors) among Spanish-speaking patients with diabetes. Her research interests are telehealth use among marginalized populations, Latinx health and healthcare, pathway programs, and health equity. She completed a 2-year UCLA T32 NRSA Primary Care & Health Services Research Fellowship and a Master of Science in Health Policy and Management at UCLA.

Dr. Hernandez mentors medical students and residents and serves as a co-director for the Department's pathway program for high school students in Van Nuys.
